2. The General Meeting endorsed the following conclusions:

- The participants reiterated their commitment to the principles of the Declaration of Rome
- The meeting endorsed the proposals of the five Working Groups,
- The meeting urged IMPACT to address Good Governance, ISO standards, and Good Business Practices,
- IMPACT should stress the importance of addressing the promotion of public and personal health,
- IMPACT work should be tabled at the World Health Assembly,
- The next World Health Report should include a feature on Counterfeit Medical Products and IMPACT activities with special focus on public health, safety and security aspects,
- The work of IMPACT should be expanded to include medical devices and related medical products.
